#### 1. Papers & Posters:

All accepted papers with registration will be printed in the Proceedings. Papers may not be in press or under consideration for publication elsewhere.

- An opening summary of 250 to 300 words.
- A general description of the content of the tutorial. An outline of topics to be covered.
- Specific educational goals that attendees can expect to achieve.
- A description of who should attend. And a description of prerequisites, if any.

- O An indication of the level of content (percentage of basic, intermediate, and advanced material covered).
- A list of similar tutorials, courses, or workshops presented by the instructors at a major informatics or other conference.
- The name, academic degree(s), affiliations, and locations (city, state, and country) of all instructors.

# About Taipei & Taiwan

Taiwan is a mountainous island and includes Penghu and other scattered 13 islands,the geographical features Taiwan is of surrounded by the sea. Taiwan faces the Pacific Ocean in the east and the Taiwan Strait in the west, it is separated from the Mainland China by the Taiwan Strait.



The area of Taiwan is 36,000 square kilometers, and the population is about 22 million. Taipei City is the capital of Taiwan which located in the Taipei basin of northern Taiwan, surrounded on four sides by Taipei County, population is around 2.64 million; and it is center of culture, business and politics. The religion of Chinese people in Taiwan are Buddhism, Taoism and Christian.

#### Climate

The Tropic of Cancer divides Taiwan into two zones, one is the tropical zone and the other is the sub-tropical zone. The capital-Taipei City is Subtropical climate; average yearly temperature 22.6 °C (72.5 °F). Summer lasts from May until September and is typically hot and humid. July is the hottest month with an average temperature of 29  $^{\circ}C$  (84  $^{\circ}F$ ). Autumn, from October to November, is probably the most pleasant time to visit Taipei, with average temperatures of  $23^{\circ}$ C ( $73^{\circ}$ F). Winter lasts from December to February. January average temperatures are about 15  $^{\circ}$ C (59 $^{\circ}$ F), but there is often a strong wind and rain, which can make the weather seem quite chilly. The rainy season lasts from April to May, but sometimes extends into September. In the spring, Taipei blooms with dazzling azaleas and temperatures around 20  $^\circ\!C$  (68 °F).

#### Language

Official language : Mandarin Chinese

Other dialects : Southern Fujianese (Taiwanese) and Hakka

#### Currency

The New Taiwan Dollar (NT\$) is the currency used in Taiwan. Paper money is currently available in NT\$100, NT\$200, NT\$500, NT\$1,000, and NT\$2,000 bills. Coins are NT\$1, NT\$5, NT\$10 and NT\$50 denominations. Payment by credit card is accepted at hotels, department stores, airports and large restaurants.

#### Tipping

A 10 percent service charge is usually automatically added to room rates and meals. Other tipping is optional, but rare, including for Taxis.

Transportation Fares

#### Electricity & Drinking Water

Taiwan uses electric current of 110 volts at 60 cycles. Tap water is drinkable but drinking unboiled water is not recommended. Most hotels provide boiled drinking water. Bottled spring water is easily available at convenience stores and supermarkets.

#### Public Telephone

Public telephones are either coin-operated or card-operated. All local and domestic long-distance calls are timed. The basic charge for a local call is NT\$1. Telephone cards can be purchased at most convenience stores and from Chunghwa Telecom offices.

International Direct Dial (IDD) calls can be made by dialing the international dialing code <u>002 + country code +</u> <u>city code + local number</u>. International reverse-charge and credit card calls can be made through dedicated phones located at international airports and major hotels. You can also call the United States using AT&T Direct service and over 100 other countries through AT&T World Connect services by calling 0080-102-880.

For English-speaking directory assistance in Taipei, call tel: 2-2311-6796 or 106 and in Kaohsiung call tel: 344-6634. Fax facilities are available at some convenience stores, major post offices and tourist hotels. GSM 900 or 1800 mobile phones may be roaming in Taiwan, please ask your original mobile phone company.

#### CKS International Airport

CKS International Airport in Taoyuan County is Taipei's main gateway and is a 40-minute ride away from the city center. There are two terminals in the Airport. Four bus companies, Kuo Guang Bus, Free Go, Air Bus, and Evervoyage, operate a shuttle service every 15 to 30 minutes to and from Taipei from 5:30am to 1:30am. The shuttle each way costs between NT\$120 to 150 per passenger. The bus usually has two major stops: Taipei Train Station(in the city center and closer to major city sights) and Sungshan Domestic Airport (in the eastern section of the city). Taxis queue outside the Arrival Halls of both terminals. The service is also provided 24 hours a day. Airport Taxis charge according to the meter plus a 50% surcharge (highway tolls not included) and typically costs around NT\$1,100 to Taipei.
